#### National CineMedia, Inc. Reports Results for Fiscal Third Quarter 2017

Announces Quarterly Cash Dividend of \$0.22 per Share Reaffirms Full Year 2017 Outlook

Centennial, CO – November 6, 2017 – National CineMedia, Inc. (NASDAQ: NCMI) (the Company), the managing member and owner of 49.5% of National CineMedia, LLC (NCM LLC), the operator of the largest in-theater digital media network in North America, today announced consolidated results for the fiscal third quarter and nine months ended September 28, 2017.

Total revenue for the third quarter ended September 28, 2017 increased 2.6% to \$116.4 million from \$113.5 million for the comparable quarter last year. Adjusted OIBDA increased 2.8% to \$62.6 million for the third quarter of 2017 from \$60.9 million for the third quarter of 2016. Operating income increased 3.9% to \$50.3 million for the third quarter of 2017 from \$48.4 million, for the third quarter of 2016. Net income for the third quarter of 2017 was \$9.4 million, or net income of \$0.15 per diluted share, compared to net income of \$8.2 million, or net income of \$0.13 per diluted share, for the third quarter of 2016. As adjusted to exclude the CEO transition-related costs, the reversal of a reserve for uncertain tax positions and other non-recurring items set forth in the table at the end of this release, net income for the third quarter of 2017 would have been \$0.12 per diluted share and net income for the third quarter of 2016 would have remained \$0.13 per diluted share.

Total revenue for the nine months ended September 28, 2017 decreased 6.5% to \$285.4 million from \$305.1 million for the comparable period last year. Adjusted OIBDA decreased 15.1% to \$122.5 million for the first nine months of 2017 from \$144.3 million for the first nine months of 2016. Operating income decreased 16.9% to \$83.7 million for the first nine months of 2017 from \$100.7 million for the first nine months of 2016. Included in Adjusted OIBDA and operating income were \$3.1 million and \$0.7 million of non-cash impairment charges during the first nine months of 2017 and the first nine months of 2016, respectively, on investments obtained in prior years in exchange for advertising services. Net income for the first nine months of 2017 was \$5.9 million, or income of \$0.10 per diluted share, compared to net income of \$10.7 million, or income of \$0.18 per diluted share for the first nine months of 2016. As adjusted to exclude the CEO transition-related costs, the reversal of a reserve for uncertain tax positions and certain other non-recurring items set forth in the table at the end of this release, net income for the first nine months of 2016 would have been \$0.20 per diluted share. Adjusted OIBDA and adjusted earnings per share are non-GAAP measures. See the tables at the end of this release for the reconciliations to the closest GAAP basis measurement.

The Company announced today that its Board of Directors has authorized the Company's regular quarterly cash dividend of \$0.22 per share of common stock. The dividend will be paid on December 1, 2017 to stockholders of record on November 16, 2017. The Company intends to pay a regular quarterly dividend for the foreseeable future at the discretion of the Board of Directors consistent with the Company's intention to distribute over time a substantial portion of its free cash flow. The declaration, payment, timing and amount of any future dividends payable will be at the sole discretion of the Board of Directors who will take into account general economic and advertising market business conditions, the Company's financial condition, available cash, current and anticipated cash needs, and any other factors that the Board of Directors considers relevant. While it is the intention of the Company to continue its practice of distributing a high proportion of its free cash flow, actual results, ongoing reinvestment in its network and product offerings, as well as, prudent capital management may reduce such distributable free cash flow in future periods. As a result, the Board of Directors continues to review these factors to determine a sustainable distribution rate which balances the operating and strategic needs of the Company with those of its lenders and stockholders.

Commenting on the Company's third quarter of 2017 operating results, Andy England, NCM's CEO said, "I'm very pleased with our third quarter results, as we were able to achieve a stable quarter following a challenging first half of the year. Third quarter 2017 revenue was up 2.6% over last year as the scatter market rebounded in our favor, even as network attendance was down 16.1%. The launch of our new *Noovie* preshow in September is just the beginning of a new era at NCM, as we continue to lay the foundation for our *Noovie* digital products ecosystem and work toward achieving our vision to be THE connector between brands and movie audiences, wherever they may be."

#### 2017 Outlook

For the full year 2017, the Company reaffirms its outlook of total revenue to be down 6% to 1% and Adjusted OIBDA to be down 12% to 6% from the full year 2016. The Company expects total revenue in the range of \$422.0 million to \$442.0 million for the full year 2017, compared to total revenue for the full year 2016 of \$447.6 million and Adjusted OIBDA in the range of \$202.0 million to \$217.0 million for the full year 2017 compared to Adjusted OIBDA for the full year 2016 of \$230.7 million. Currently, total revenue and Adjusted OIBDA are trending towards the lower end of these ranges for the full year 2017. This outlook includes the impact of an 8% increase in the theater access fee paid to the founding members that occurs every five years as well as the non-cash impairment charges of \$3.1 million recorded for the first nine months of 2017, described above. During 2017, the Company expects to record approximately \$18.0 million in integration and other encumbered theater payments from Cinemark and AMC associated with the Rave Theatres and Carmike Theatres acquisitions, which are recorded as a reduction of an intangible asset.

#### **Supplemental Information**

Integration and other encumbered theater payments due from Cinemark and AMC associated with Rave Theatres and Carmike Theatres for the quarter ended September 28, 2017 and September 29, 2016 and nine months ended September 28, 2017 and September 29, 2016 were \$6.9 million, \$0.7 million, \$11.6 million and \$1.5 million, respectively. These payments were recorded as a reduction of an intangible asset.

#### OIBDA, Adjusted OIBDA and Adjusted OIBDA Margin

Operating Income Before Depreciation and Amortization ("OIBDA"), Adjusted OIBDA and Adjusted OIBDA margin are not financial measures calculated in accordance with GAAP in the United States. OIBDA represents operating income before depreciation and amortization expense. Adjusted OIBDA by total revenue. Our management uses these non-GAAP financial measures to evaluate operating performance, to forecast future results and as a basis for compensation. The Company believes these are important supplemental measures of operating performance because they eliminate items that have less bearing on its operating performance and so highlight trends in its core business that may not otherwise be apparent when relying solely on GAAP financial measures. Our management uses these non-GAAP financial measures as an additional tool to evaluate operating performance. The Company believes these are important supplemental measures of operating performance because they eliminate items that have less bearing on its operating performance and so highlight trends in its core business that may not otherwise be apparent when relying solely on GAAP financial measures. The Company believes the presentation of these measures is relevant and useful for investors because it enables them to view performance in a manner similar to a method used by the Company's management and helps improve their ability to understand the Company's operating performance. Adjusted net loss should not be regarded as an alternative to net income and should not be regarded as an alternative to loss per share or as indicators of operating performance, nor should they be considered in isolation of, or as substitutes for financial measures prepared in accordance with GAAP. The Company believes that net income and income per share are the most directly comparable GAAP financial measures. Because not all companies use identical calculations, these presentations may not be comparable to other similarly titled measures of other companies.
